NEW! Downloadable datasets from the CeLSIUS website

You can now download direct from the CeLSIUS website two **aggregated LS datasets** on the topics: **ethnicity** and **limiting long term illness**. Data can be accessed and manipulated in both Stata and SPSS formats (other formats can be considered if there is any demand for them).

Each dataset is supplemented by details of the variables and values included and a set of exercises suitable for students – particularly those studying health or social sciences.

These datasets and exercises will be useful to **lecturers and supervisors** as teaching resources, for example in practical sessions, in demonstrations of descriptive statistics or as a basis for student projects. **Students** could find the datasets and exercises useful for practising skills in data analysis or using the material to support an argument in an essay or project.

CeLSIUS is happy to consider creating further such datasets for lecturers; please get in touch if you have a suggested topic.

NEW! Web table on household changes

We have added a new set of web tables to the existing suite on the topic 'Household change in later life' which you can find at <http://www.celsius.lshtm.ac.uk/download/wt030000.html>

Key research questions addressed are

- How do living arrangements change in later life?
- Are the changes different for men and women?

The tables can be freely downloaded in HTML or Excel format then manipulated and stored on your own computer.

Online training module:

This module introduces ethnicity in the ONS LS, some of the ways in which it might be used and further illustrates the topic by exploring the research question: What differences are there between ethnic groups in the numbers of people who move from local authority housing to become owner-occupiers, and how have these numbers changed over time?

Neville Butler Memorial Prizewinner

The first prize for this competition aimed at early career longitudinal researchers was won by Martina Portanti and Simon Whitworth of the ONS for their paper 'A comparison of the characteristics of childless women and mothers in the ONS Longitudinal Study'.

The second prize went to Dylan Kneale who recently completed his PhD at the Centre for Longitudinal Studies. His paper used other cohort studies to examine 'Pathways to parenthood: Housing and the lifecourse'.
